Long-time Commerce City, Colorado commercial fence contractor Metro Fence Company, Inc. is well versed in the complexities of high security fence and barrier installations, but a project at the FBI regional field office in Denver takes the cake.

From its regional offices, the FBI investigates federal crimes ranging from terrorism to gang activity, which makes it critical that the perimeters of the locations be hardened to the maximum.

Metro Fence Company president Vernon Knorr notes that the Denver project involved installing approximately 2,500 lineal feet of Department of State anti-terrorist crash rated fence, along with numerous crash rated bollards, crash rated entrance/exit hydraulic wedge barrier systems and automated gate systems throughout the project site.

According to Knorr, the project started off with 15% drawings in September of 2007, 30% in May of 2008, 60% in December 2008 and, finally, 100% in March of 2009. Each of these milestones required numerous proposals and re-quotations from many suppliers and conceptual revisions that changed often. Knorr estimates that they proposed and priced upwards of 40 to 50 designs before one was accepted.

"We entered into contract negotiations with Bovis Lend Lease of Nashville, Tenn. in April 2009 and came to final agreement to scope and

terms in mid-June of 2009," he said. "Contract items totaled approximately \$1.3 million, and the project had a total duration of approximately 240 calendar days. The fence design was provided by architect Skidmore, Owens & Merrill LLP of Chicago."

On site installation started in late August 2009. There were numerous delays to the start time due to the

merous release forms, and this was followed by fingerprint submission and a full background check that could take days to complete," he said. "Everyone entering this site, including delivery truck drivers, concrete truck drivers and rental equipment companies, had to go through this process. Once background checks passed, deliveries had to be scheduled two to three days in advance.

"Once on site, at the entry gates the delivery vehicles were physically inspected before being allowed on site with a badged employee driving," he

HySecurity StrongArm M30 earns highest crash rating

Sweat poured off David Younce's forehead in Southern California's high desert blazing summer sun on Aug. 9. Younce hadn't slept much the night before, tossing and turning, knowing that today would successfully cap a year-and-a-half's work, or ...

That day marked the crash test of HySecurity's new StrongArm M30 barrier arm, which was Younce's "baby."

He was the project mechanical engineer and led the project engineering. Through design and phase reviews, customer redirects that slowed and changed the project scope, multiple prototypes and the final Alpha test model, Younce had spent most of his waking hours working alone and with the project team for 18 months to



design a better M30 fortified crash barrier arm.

In a few seconds, hundreds of hours of work, Younce's reputation and the reputations of others, and a very large HySecurity investment could be lost in a pile of StrongArm M30 rubble and a runaway 15,000-pound truck that passed through the expected impenetrable barrier. These and more anxieties crossed Younce's mind as he methodically assembled the test operator and watched the lab technicians take their measurements to document the trial. Chief engineer Steve Carlsen stood by.

Then at precisely 10:15 a.m., a GMC 7000 truck loaded to weigh 15,000 pounds was sent on a 30 mph collision course with the closed 12 foot StrongArm M30.

"I tried to watch, to see the details," said Younce. "It was too much. All I could take in was whether or not the truck penetrated. If it had gone wrong, it would have been on me. I was hugely relieved – it stopped. This is a huge step for HySecurity in our first crash product."

Carlsen noted that HySecurity had

overbuilt the machine to the degree that outside reviewers urged them to test it at M40 (K8). "The test machine sustained so little damage that the posts will be refurbished and used as a

working trade show operator," he noted.

In fact, StrongArm M30 earned the highest M30 rating possible: P1, indicating that the truck had penetrated less than a meter.

According to Younce, site technicians said that the crash was extremely "soft," and that the arm had slowed the truck so much that very little debris spread far from the point of impact. That was highly unusual, they said.

Brian DeNault, HySecurity president, lauded the work of his engineering team before and after the crash test.

"We're getting used to platinum performance from our engineers," said DeNault. "This puts HySecurity in a great position as we introduce two to three new products a year, each with its own 'wow' factor."

DeNault said his confidence was strong enough that he didn't attend the test.

He added that with the success of the StrongArm M30 testing, they have begun filling a sizeable backlog of orders. The company will introduce a crash wedge and several non-crash products beginning in early 2012.
